Summer Work Experience Program

Once again SWEP is under way for the 1997 year. Positions can be full- or part-time. Jobs can run a maximum of 16 weeks in the 17-week window between May 5 and August 29, 1997. SWEP jobs must not displace existing employees. Employers may partially contribute to student salaries or may receive 100% SWEP funding; 55% of SWEP jobs will be chosen from the partially funded category and 45% from the fully funded category in order to maximize employment opportunities for students. The student wage

is \$9.00/hour regardless of the source of funding. If you wish to submit a job proposal you must do so using a SWEP Job Proposal form, which may be obtained by writing or calling: Helen Coo, SWEP Coordinator, Career Services, Tel. ext. 7324 or fax: 22535. Submission deadline for job proposals is **January 10, 1997.**

Good News!

December 23 and December 24 until noon has been designated as non-working days for all Queens general staff employees, without loss of salary. Any employee required to work on either of those days, will receive equivalent time off at a mutually convenient time. The rest of the contract agreement with non-union support staff (July 1 1996 to June 30 1997) was:

- the existing staff salary grid continues
- no progression along the steps until 1997 July
- benefits maintained at current levels
- no involuntary salary reductions until at least 1997 June 30



Queen's has recently signed a licence for a virus protection package called Dr. Solomon's Anti-Virus. We will have licence to use DOS, windows 3.1x, windows 95 and Mac versions at no cost. This should be available "real-soonnow". This will replace for the most part the F-PROT and VIRSTOP system we have in place on workstations now.

Packman is a program concept to allow endusers to upgrade specific software applications (eg ftp, telnet, anti-virus) in an automated method from Queen's ITS. The complexity has proven to be high and it will be some time before this is rolled out.

Lotus Notes a few small groups on campus are doing some pilot tests with this integrated Office Package. Further distribution is still a ways off (next summer at least?).

Eudora Pro upgrade: Queen's uses Eudora v1.5.4 as a freeware pop3 email program for general use. A new \$\$ version 3.0 has been released but there is no urgency in upgrading as the old one still works fine. ADSM Backup service: Effective 1
December 1996, there will be a \$50
registration fee for all **new users** of the
ADSM (ADSTAR Distributed Storage
Manager) back-up program. According
to Queens ITS manager Andy Hooper,
the move has become necessary due to
increased costs of providing this service.
Users currently registered for ADSM
will not be required to pay the fee.
