Crohn's & Colitis Foundation of Canada Two calls for applications. The Armstrong Ontario Fellowship in Nutritional

Sciences Related to IBD. This

Fellowship was created as a result of a bequest which stipulates that the funds be used in Ontario for the support of nutritional research in inflammatory bowel disease (IBD) particularly Crohn's disease. This is a limited term fellowship. The Fellowship will be for a maximum of three years, not to exceed \$40,000/annum. Deadline is **April 1, 1997.**

The second grant will fund novel or innovative approaches to Inflammatory Bowel Disease research. This is an annual award with a maximum stipend of \$20,000. Deadline for submissions of applications is **April 1, 1997.**

Canadian Space Agency

The Canadian Space Agency is pleased to announce opportunities for Canadian researchers to participate in the international program of spaceflight research on the NASA space shuttle and early phase of the International Space Station.

Proposals due to the Canadian Space Agency, March 15, 1997. For Canadian investigators - proposals submitted through any other agency but the CSA will not be considered for funding. Principal's Development Fund 1997-98

The Committee of Principal, Vice-Principals and Deans has decided again to allocate \$140,000 from the Principal's Development Fund to the upgrading of our classrooms. The 97/98 Principals' Development Fund is categorized as follows:

Category A

Applications for support of visiting scholars may be made to a fund of up to \$50,000 apportioned to and administered by the faculty deans to encourage academic visits by women, visible minorities, aboriginal peoples and people with disabilities. Apply directly to Deans.

Category B

B1 A sum of \$190,000 is allocated to the Advisory Research Committee from the PDF in addition to the General Research Grant from SSHRC to fund the following three objectives: i) to provide support to new faculty members to assist them in beginning their research programs and in obtaining external funding. ii) To provide seed funding in support of new research initiatives for established faculty members.

Applications under sections I and ii must be submitted on ARC forms by September 15 for the 1997 competition (note this application date is under review and may be changed).

B2 A sum of \$100,000 is

allocated to the Office of Research Services to provide conference travel support for new and established researchers. Applications are accepted on September 15, January 15 and April 15. Application forms are available from the Office of Research Services.

Technology Partnerships Program

The Technology Partnerships Program (TPP) was announced in January 1995 as a three year pilot program. At this point there is no indication that it will be extended. Applications for funding will be accepted until


December 31, 1997.
